# BEVERLEY WIN PREMIERSHIP

**Although the winning margin was only four points, the sweetness of victory proved ample compensation for Beverley's disappointing final round performances in 1974 and 1975, when they out-bumped and out-played Cunderdin in the Avon Football Association's grand final at Cunderdin on Sunday.**

The Beverley players overcame the Magpies home ground advantage and a poor first term, when they could only manage a three-point break with the use of a strong, gusty breeze, to outplay their opponents for the final three quarters.

Although the conditions made for scrambly and at times very congested play it was great final-round football — and the narrow margin throughout always had the large crowd on their toes.

Cunderdin appeared set to open up a match-winning break when they slammed on two quick goals in the opening minutes of the second term, but the Beverley defence steadied and only allowed the Magpies another three goals for the match. However Beverley, too, found goals hard to come by against a strong Cunderdin defence and it was only a great 5-7 third quarter effort which gave them a 13 point lead at the final change and enough margin to hold out the home side in a do-or-die final quarter.

The match culminated a great coaching debut by Neil Wittorff and his courage on the field was an inspiration to his team-mates. The two final round matches played by Beverley this year were also a triumph for Ross Luckman who contributed two 'best-on-the-ground' performances and won the Pat Denis Medal for the fairest and best in the grand final.

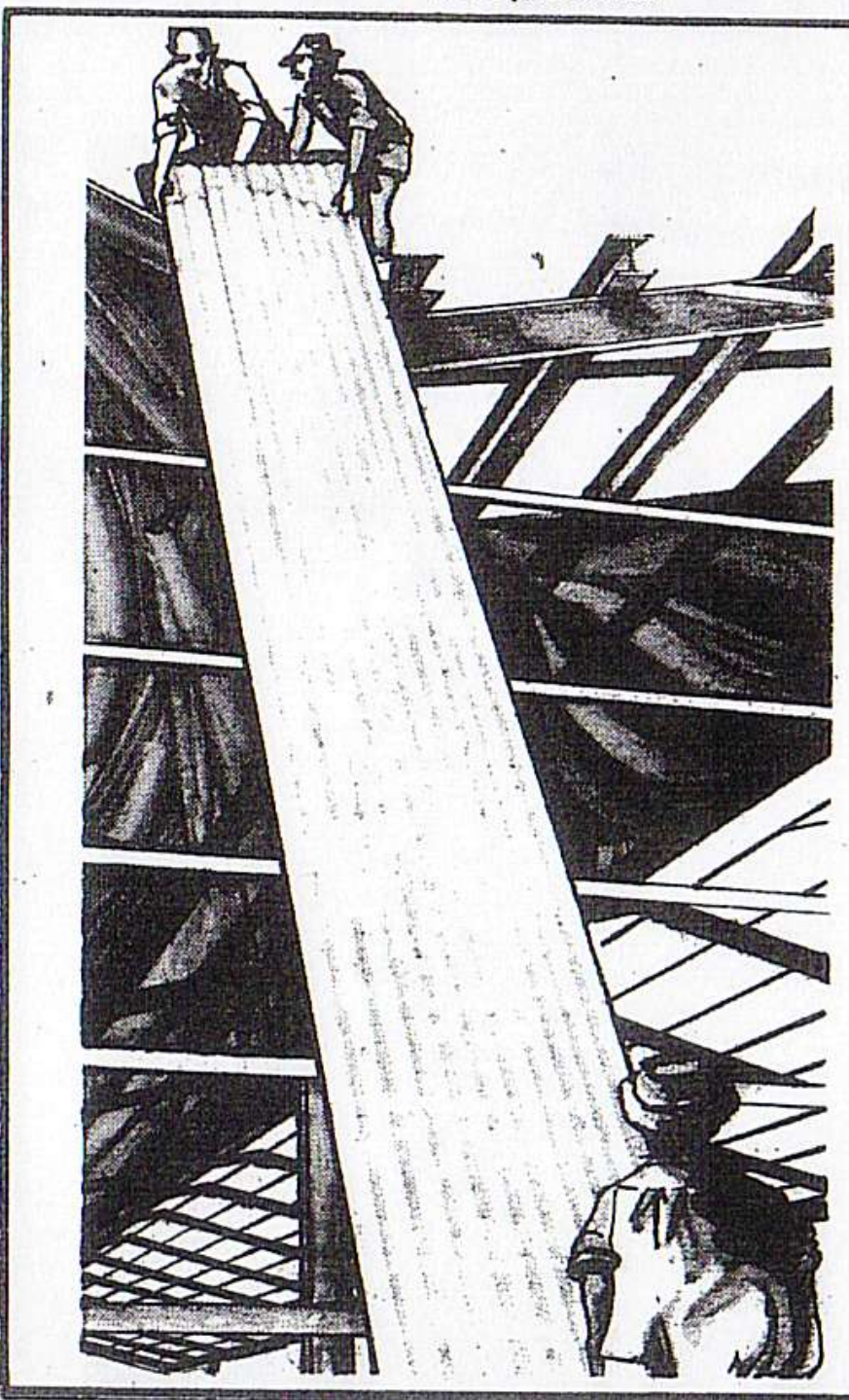
Apart from Luckman, Beverley were best served by 'Angus' Mourish (a great game on the ball and around the ground) and Steve Minchin, whose courageous play — especially in the first half — kept the Red and Blacks in the game. However it was a real team effort with every player giving of his best,

and all are to be congratulated on their effort.

The win was even more meritorious when one considers the

fact that Beverley were without the services of three top class players in Edwards and Broad (through injury) and 'Nooky' Ridgway (who came down with the mumps only a few days before the game).
